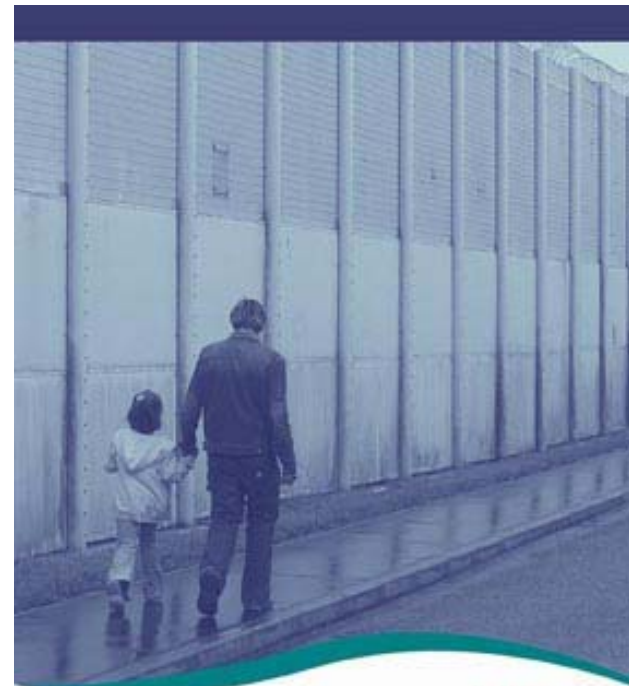

NOMS Children and Families Pathway

Children and families can play a significant role in supporting an offender to make and sustain changes which reduce reoffending. However, many offenders' relationships are broken or fragmented as a result of their offending leaving their families unsupported and increasing the likelihood of inter-generational offending, mental health and financial problems.

How we aim to support offenders' family relationships:

- ensure life skills, including parenting and relationship skills, are provided for offenders through mainstream support
- engage with the voluntary and community sector and faith communities in supporting children and families
- develop better advice and guidance for offenders' children and families
- ensure the needs of offenders' children and families are considered within the implementation of **Every Child Matters** the Government's strategy to improve life chances for all children
- recognise that the most prolific offenders are often those with the most challenging lifestyles who require additional help to maintain their family ties.
